Easter 2016

My friends:

During this past week we have gathered to commemorate the events in the life of one man that affected all people and all creation for all time. Our Easter Sunday celebrations bring us to the pinnacle of those commemorations. Today we say that in the life of Jesus of Nazareth, one who lived long ago and far away, we not only saw the depth of God's love, but we have been given new life ourselves.

As we gather with family and friends to celebrate Easter, the Risen Lord Jesus is present with us. As we listen to the scriptures proclaimed, as we share in his Body and Blood, and as we gather around our tables at home and look into the faces of those we love, the Risen Lord Jesus is present.

As we remember loved-ones who no longer gather with us, and as we reflect on the disappointments of the past year, the Risen Lord Jesus is with us. As we celebrate a new relationship or reconciliation with a person we have been estranged from, the Lord Jesus is with us.

His Risen presence today, right now, is what our celebrations of Easter are all about. Sometimes we can be misled, because of the nature of our liturgical celebrations, into thinking that all we do on Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday is look back on something that happened 2000 years ago in a small town in the Roman Empire.

But our liturgies are much more than historical reenactments. When we gather for liturgy we return to our roots and our remembering of what God did long ago is a dynamic experience. In our remembering we are plunged once again into the saving power of those events of long ago. But we are plunged into those events not because we are somehow transported back in time to Jerusalem, but because those saving actions of God are made present to us today in San Diego California!.

We believe that power of God is still here among us because we believe it is the Risen Christ who gathers us together. We remember those events of the past with the aid of the Holy Spirit of God who lives with us right now. Why does this matter? Because the God who accompanied Jesus in his life on earth and raised him from death to new life, is the same God who is present to us today, accompanying us on our way. It is this same God who raises our loved ones from death to new life with Him, and will raise us also someday to be with Him and with all our loved ones forever. It is the same God who will, at the end of time, restore all creation according to the pattern of his risen and glorified body.

It is in this Spirit that we gather each Sunday of the year. It is in this Spirit that each "first day of the week," we come together as a community of faith to give praise and thanks to God for the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Each Sunday is like a "little Easter."

In all of our celebrations we give thanks for what God has done, is doing, and will continue to do until the end of time. That work of God is always about bringing new life out of death. In these days of Easter may all of us draw near to the Risen and Glorified Christ so that he may show us the way to new and eternal life. Amen, Alleluia!


